## **Facts and Figures**



#### **UK Wide**

- Over 2 million people in the UK living with sight loss.
- 1 in 5 people will experience sight loss in their lifetime.
- 250 start losing their sight everyday

#### London

- 217, 000 people living with sight loss
- Only 40,420 are registered for their certificate of visual impairment
- 2032 projection is around 264,000
- Dementia 75,000
- Hearing Loss 80,000
- Refugees 132,000
